The Vision



- A collaborative, active measurement network
- Should potentially be on “unprecedented” scale, perhaps with vantage points in *every network*
- Community involvement - the RIPE NCC shouldn't do this alone
- Focus on the “network level” measurements as much as possible
- Create and nurture an ecosystem of contributors and users
- Provide a long-term, sustainable platform

The First ~10 Years



- 2007-2008 ● Inspirations, prior art and exploring the problem
 - PlanetLab, iPlane, Hubble
- Early 2008 ● Feasibility studies, codename “DAR”
- Late 2008 ● Early planning (potential, challenges, ...)
- 2008Q4-2009Q1 ● An intern (Philo) explores hardware options
 - Digi Connect ME9210
 - Lantronix MatchPort/XPort AR
- 2009 ● Architecture design, early stages
- May 2009 ● First public presentation at RIPE 58



The First ~10 Years



- 2010Q1 ● Internal “go” decision, selection of v1 hardware, selection of hardware engineering partner. Launch target: RIPE 61 (November 2010, Rome)
- 2010Q1 ● First external supporter found
- Jun/Jul 2010 ● Switching to high gear
- Jul 2010 ● Delivery schedule for the first 500 probes (things get exciting!):
 - 3 September: 2 prototypes
 - 17 September: 100 pieces
 - 18 October: 400 pieces



The First ~10 Years



- Aug 2010 ● Hiring the first two developers dedicated to DAR
 - Viktor and Andreas
- Sep 2010 ● First UI mockups
- 7 Oct 2010 ● RIPE NCC borrel, the name “atlas” comes up
- 8 Oct 2010 ● “RIPE Atlas” is accepted as the official name
- 11 Oct 2010 ● All code and UI pages are updated to use “RIPE Atlas”
- Mid-Oct 2010 ● Infrastructure components start functioning



The First ~10 Years



- 29 Oct 2010 ● First (VIP) probes go online
- 7 Nov 2010 ● First graphs for probes appear (ping results)
- 15 Nov 2010 ● Announcement at RIPE 61 (Rome)
 - Official birthday of the service
- Oct 2011 ● First “User Defined Measurements” started
- 15 Oct 2011 ● New probe version: v2
- 12 Dec 2011 ● Milestone: 1.000 connected probes
- 12 Dec 2012 ● RIPE Atlas anchors introduced
- 2 Feb 2013 ● New probe version: v3



The First ~10 Years



- 3 Mar 2014 ● Milestone: 5.000 connected probes
- 23 May 2016 ● API v2 introduced
- 21 Aug 2017 ● Milestone: 10.000 connected probes
- 21 Dec 2017 ● VM anchors announced
- 8 Mar 2018 ● First VM anchor goes live
- 8 May 2018 ● New probe version: v4
- 2 Oct 2019 ● Software probes are introduced
- Oct 2020 ● RIPE 81



At 10 Years



- We're at ~11.400 connected probes
 - ~1.350 are v1/v2 (!)
 - ~6.000 are v3
 - ~2.600 are v4
 - ~750 are software
 - ~650 are anchors (about half of these are virtual)
- On average about 25.000 measurements are running
- We cover 177 countries, ~3.700 ASNs
- The “most alive” probe has been up and running for:
 - 9y 318d 16h 28m (and a bit more by now)

Celebrating 10 Years



- The RIPE Atlas UI will get a significant facelift
 - Expect changes soon after RIPE 81
- We're introducing “birthday presents” for probes
 - Recognising the long-term support from our probe hosts
- We'll be publishing some “tales from the past” and preparing a few other gimmicks
- Organising a RIPE NCC Open House event and a Deployathon
- Please join the RIPE81 Atlas community room

After 10 Years



- We plan to make the system more useful to more users
 - Better access to data (simpler, faster, ...)
 - More out-of-the-box support for particular use cases
- Increase value for individual contributors such as probe hosts
- Improve on processes that “help our helpers”
 - E.g. ambassadors and sponsors
- Focus on increased network coverage, if possible
 - Various activities to get probes into more networks
